Materials: You need to bring a *pencil* and *eraser* everyday.

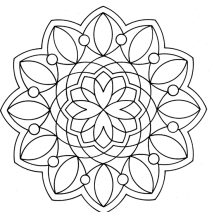

Advanced Anime Class At-a-Glance

Phase 1: Colors and Shapes

Goal: Students explore and create art with different color wheel combinations. Students also identify and utilize the different elements of shape.



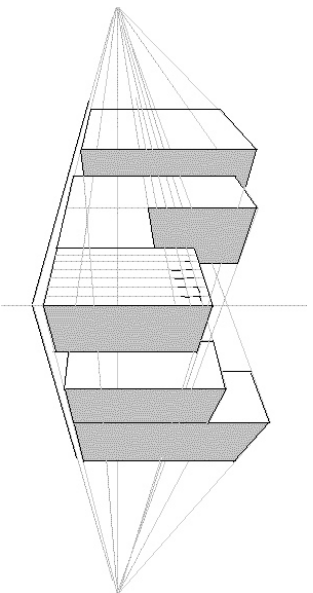
Phase 2: Faces, Bodies, & Characterization

Goal: Students identify and use different drawing techniques, such as proportion and negative space, to create faces and bodies. Students also identify, analyze, and create original characters using characterization.



Phase 3: Setting and Shadow

Goal: Students create different settings and use a variety of shading techniques, such as hatching and cross-hatching. Students also analyze how different settings are used to help tell a story.



Throughout the Year: Storytelling

Goal: Students will analyze techniques that storytellers use to tell their stories. Students will analyze four separate anime series and also study various manga chapters.
